 - The only public psychiatric hospital serving Northern Nevada, Dini-Townsend Hospital offers acute crisis stabilization on the Rapid Stabilization Unit. This unit has 10 beds. An additional 20 beds are open for acute medical stabilization for individuals who need more intensive therapy. This unit has an average length of stay of about 14 days.

In facilities that emphasize treatment for co-occurring disorders, staff members have specialized training and qualifications in dual diagnosis treatment.
 - **Mental Health Diversion Program** This program offers eligible offenders a treatment option through diversion. The mission of the Mental Health Diversion Program is to identify mentally impaired offenders and divert them from the Juvenile Justice System and into appropriate rehabilitative alternatives with trained mental health clinicians.
